RIVERSIDE CITY COUNCIL MEETING: February 20, 2018

City Council held a budget workshop with the Riverside Volunteer fire Department at 6:00 pm to discuss budget items for FY 18-19.

The Riverside City Council meeting opened at 6:30 pm in City Hall with Mayor Allen Schneider requesting roll call. Council members present were: Tom Sexton, Rob Weber, Jeanine Redlinger, and Andy Rodgers. Bob Schneider Jr. was absent.

Motion by Sexton to approve the agenda, Second by Rodgers, passed 4-0.

Warren McKenna gave his final report to the council concerning solar arrays at the water and waste water plants. McKenna advised that it was not cost effective to go with a solar installation at this time.

Chad Smothers, Fire Chief, Curtis Sexton and Chad Sexton were in attendance for the Annual Fire District Meeting. The Council was presented with a slide show of the past year's activities.

Weber moved to pass Resolution #022018-01 Accepting new Fire Department members. Second by Redlinger, passed 4-0.

Phil Richman addressed Council about complaints of citizens not clearing their sidewalks of snow within 48 hours, as stated in City Ordinance.

MMS Consultants Scott Pottorff and Ben Mitchell updated Council on Capital Projects.

Bids were reviewed for the Downtown Streetscape Project.

Weber moved to award the Construction Contract for the Downtown Streetscape Project to J&L Construction, LLC of Washington, IA for \$1,713.250.05. Second by Redlinger, passed 4-0.

Galileo Street width and parking options were reviewed.

Sexton moved to make Galileo Street 31' wide, with on- street parking on south side, and adding an off-street 20 stall gravel parking lot with a 15' asphalt approach from Kleopfer Street. Second by Weber, passed 4-0.

MMS will complete design plans and present at next meeting for Council approval. Bids will go out in March, and awarded in April.

MMS is working on correcting Ella Street water flow options. Mayor will contact homeowners for input.

Safe Walk to School grant funds are not available until October 2018. Council agreed to keep the St. Mary's Street water main project as planned. Sexton asked about making this street oneway.

Removing rumble strips on the W61 City portion is still being addressed with Washington County Engineering.

February ${\bf 13}^{\rm th}$ P and Z meeting minutes were accepted.

Sexton moved to pass Resolution #202018-03 Approving Hotel/Motel Tax Grant for RACC TrekFest Fireworks in the amount of \$7000. Second by Weber, passed 4-0.

Redlinger moved to pass Resolution #202018-04 Approving Hotel/Motel Tax Grant for RACC TrekFest XXXIV in the amount of \$18,800. Second by Weber, passed 4-0.

Sexton moved to pass Resolution #202018-05 Approving Hotel/Motel Tax Grant for RACC Summer Concerts in the amount of \$5000. Second by Redlinger, passed 4-0.

Good Morning,

Attached is an initial analysis related to the phase 1 of the TIF development. I have assumed that we see 7 homes built in year 1 and 7 homes built in year 2 with an assessed value of \$225,000. The generates \$304,000 TIF after the LIVII set aside of 38.02%.

If the model describes below is used and the assumptions described above hold, I am showing that the City would be about \$80,000 short in receiving TIF collections. If the homes are built more quickly or valued higher, the TIF could go up and vice versa.

Allen,

We are ready to craft a developer agreement along the lines we have talked about and that I have listed below:

- 1. The Cherry Street development cost a total of \$630 per foot including all costs in 2015. That equals a price of \$661 in 2017 dollars, so that's the cost number we are starting with.
- 2. The City will cost share the improvements on the Northern Heights subdivision with Apex. Apex will pay 17% of the cost and the City will pay \$83% of the cost, or \$550.00 per linear foot of road.
- 3. The City will pave Tupelo and bring sewer and utilities to the edge of the Northern Heights along the alignment of Galileo. The City will also purchase about 2.7 acres of the subject land from John Roetlin and will take control of the detention / retention basin.
- 4. Apex will be the developer and will annex and zone the land with the aid of the City, but Apex will take the lead.
- 5. Apex will work with HBK engineers and develop an overall concept for the subdivision and will start construction on phase I of the subdivision. It is anticipated that phase I will contain 14 lots and will have around 700 linear feet of road.
- 6. The City will reimburse Apex monthly for the % of the subdivision that has been completed which will be confirmed by MMS engineers.
- 7. Apex may move on to start the development of the next phase of lots as soon as 75% of the homes in the current phase are finished and have a certificate of occupancy.
- 8. This arrangement will continue until 2023 unless extended by mutual agreement.

Also, Apex is interested in purchasing lots on Cherry Lane. They would purchase them at \$31,000 each and the City would subordinate the lot to the construction loan. Apex would pay for them upon the closing of the home built on the lot without interest.

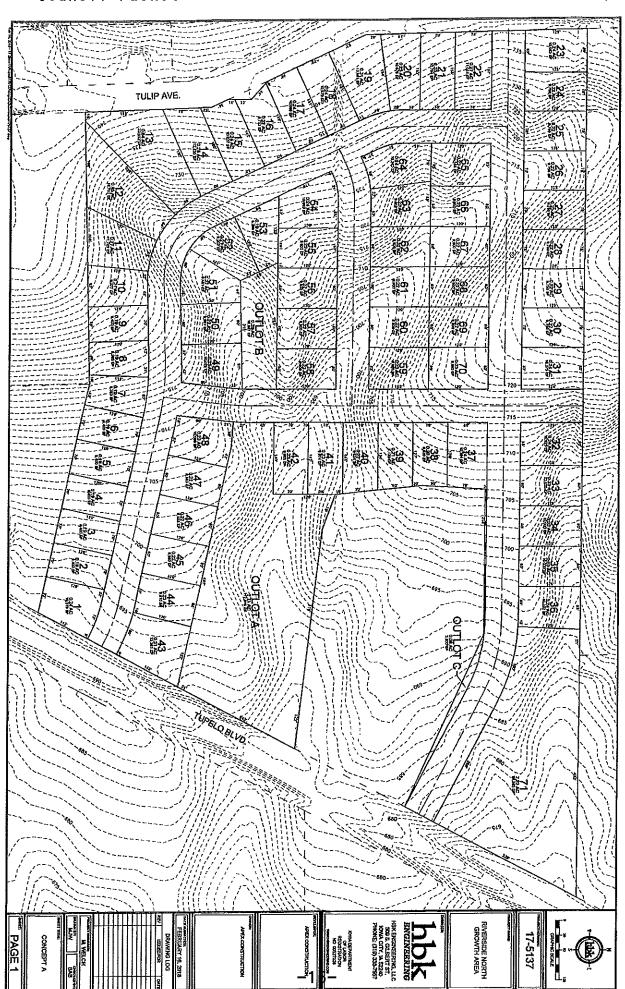

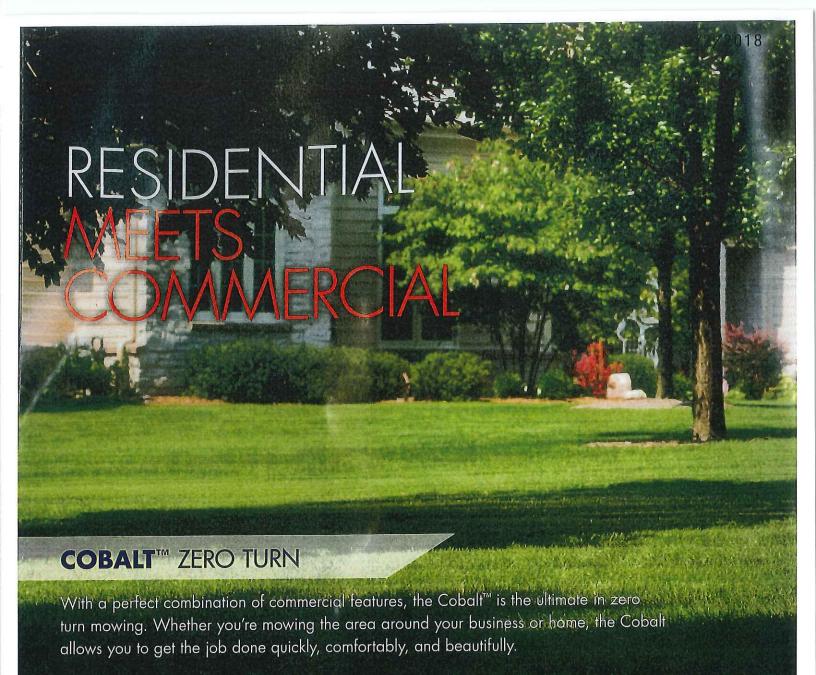

CONTRACT AND AGREEMENT LAW ENFORCEMENT

This Contract and Agreement is entered into by and between Washington County, Iowa, hereafter called County, and the City of Riverside, Iowa, hereafter called City and by consent and agreement of the Washington County, Iowa, Sheriff, hereafter called Sheriff.

The purpose of this Contract and Agreement is to establish a joint exercise of governmental powers as provided by Chapter 28E, 2018 Code of Iowa, which the County will furnish law enforcement services for the City in order to ensure the City's compliance with Iowa law.

No separate legal or administrative entity shall exist by virtue of this Contract and Agreement. The Sheriff is hereby designated as the administrator responsible for administration and fulfillment of this joint Contract and Agreement for the County.

The duration of this Contract and Agreement is for a period of one year commencing at 12:01 a.m. on the first day of July 2018 and continuing until 12:01 a.m. on the first day of July 2019.

In consideration of the services July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019 provided by the County, the City agrees to pay the county at the annual rate of \$52,581.00, in equal quarterly installments of \$13,145.25, by the 15th day of the month following the beginning of the quarter upon receipt of an invoice from the County Auditor.

The County agrees to perform the following as responsibilities of the County to the City:

- Provide law enforcement services for the City in a conscientious and good faith effort to effectively enforce the laws of the City, County, State and Federal governments and to maintain peace and order within the City.
- Provide for the administration, communications, education, training, employee resources and supervision of assigned enforcement officers by the Sheriff.
- Provide personnel, equipment, insurance, maintenance of equipment, supplies, and operational expenses of assigned enforcement officers necessary to accomplish the terms of this Contract and Agreement.

It is understood and agreed by all parties to this Contract and Agreement that:

- The Sheriff shall determine which officers shall perform duties in a given area and the time and manner in which
 duties will be performed. Residence locations of deputies assigned law enforcement responsibilities under this
 contract shall be at the sole discretion of the Sheriff.
- No joint acquisition or ownership of property will be required under this Contract and Agreement. All property owned and purchased by the County, both real and personal, under the control of the Sheriff may be utilized at the discretion of the Sheriff in carrying out his official statutory duties and those duties contemplated in this agreement. All property owned or purchased by the County, both real and personal, under the control of the Sheriff for use as provided by this agreement shall remain the property of the County.
- 3. Prior to February 15, 2019, the County will notify the City of the amount of contract consideration assessment required for the following year's law enforcement contract. The following formula will be used for computing the contract assessment. For each entity utilizing Contract Law Services; Ainsworth, Brighton, Crawfordsville, Kalona, Riverside, Wellman, and West Chester, the share is determined as follows:

Budget X (% of Assessed Value + % of Calls + % of Population)

Definitions of terms used in the Formula:
Budget is the total Contract Law projected expense.
Assessed Value is derived from the most recent Auditor's Valuation Report.
Calls are Sheriff Office calls only from the most recent calendar year Public Safety report of "Calls for Service".
Population is based on the current decennial Federal Census.

- 4. This Contract and Agreement may be terminated by any of the parties by notice in writing at least sixty (60) days prior to the effective date of the termination.
- 5. Notice to any party shall be given by delivery or mailing same to the City Clerk, in the case of the City, to the County Auditor, in the case of the County and in the case of the Sheriff, to the Office of County Sheriff.

"Communications" for purposes of this agreement, and as referenced as County responsibilities to the City, means communications for the sheriff and deputy sheriffs only. Emergency communications, including 911 dispatch services, are not provided as part of this law enforcement contract.

AGREEMENT FOR PAYMENT OF COMMUNICATIONS SERVICES FY '18-19

1. The parties to this ag	reement are the	Washington	County Communications
Commission, and the City of	Riverside	, Iowa.	

2. Since 1976, the city of Washington, Iowa and Washington County have had an agreement to provide funding for a joint communications center. The original agreement created a joint board and also allowed one seat on the board for a representative of the seven other incorporated cities in Washington County. The current 28E agreement between the city of Washington and Washington County was signed in 1989, and was amended in 2005. The amendments allowed for an additional representative for the seven cities, and established a formula for computing the share each city and the county would pay toward the operations of the communications center. These amendments were reviewed and supported by the mayors of the cities.

The operating expenses of the Washington County Communications Center are provided by Washington County and by the eight incorporated cities of Washington County, including the city of Washington.

- 3. Based on the representation and the formula (see attached), each city is sent a letter advising the council of the amount of that city's assessment for each fiscal year, based on the formula adopted by the Commission. The formula is derived by calculating a percentage of assessed values from the Auditor's valuation report, calls for service from the Public Safety Center, and population. Payment of the communications assessment is then made quarterly, and payable to the Washington County Auditor.
- 4. The services, personnel, and equipment provided by the Washington County Communications Commission under this agreement includes but is not limited to:
 - · dispatchers and dispatch supervisors
 - 24 hour staffing of the Communications Center
 - training for all dispatchers, including yearly continuing education
- each dispatcher will be trained as an Emergency Medical Dispatcher, which allows them to provide

emergency medical assistance to callers

- answering emergency calls that come into the communications center, either as a 911 call or from the non-emergency phone lines, cell phones, or radio.
- paging or calling out emergency respondes, including the First Responders or QRS, fire, ambulance, law enforcement, tow trucks, emergency management, other mutual aid and law enforcement agencies, medical examiners, and public health personnel
- entering and receiving information from state and national computer databases, including but not limited to NCIC, state Department of Transportation, Iowa Division of Criminal Investigation
- entry of arrest warrants and no contact orders, and entries when they are served or canceled.

- routine communications using radios and phones to law enforcement, fire, rescue, ambulance
 - · operation of emergency sirens and communicating severe weather warnings
- testing of emergency pagers for all first responders and fire department personnel
- operation and monitoring of recording equipment, and preserving and copying portions of recordings
 - data entry, including but not limited to calls for service and the radio log
 - monitoring and calls for repair for all of the E911 communications equipment

The Communications Commission purchased the building which houses the E911 equipment, because E911 money cannot be used to purchase structures. The Communications Commission also has purchased furniture and desks for the Communications Center. All emergency communications equipment is owned by the E911 Commission. E911 dollars do not fund the operations and services of the Washington County Communications Commission.

- 5. See appendix "A" for the funding formula that is in the 28E agreement. Also see appendix "B" which is the current assessment using the cost share formula detailed in appendix "A".
- 6. Pursuant to the representation on the Communication Commission and pursuant to the formula adopted in the 28E agreement, the city of ___Riverside___ agrees to pay the amount assessed in quarterly/monthly installments, beginning July 1 of each year. Notice of the assessment shall be sent by the Washington County Auditor as fiscal agent for the Washington County Communications Commission to the city clerk of each city. Payment shall be made within 30 (thirty) days of the receipt of the assessment notice, and shall be made payable to the "Washington County Communications Commission" and sent to the Washington County Auditor's office. The Auditor, as fiscal agent, shall credit the monies to the proper account.
- 7. The Washington County Communications Commission is a separate legal entity that is separate from either the city of Washington or Washington County. The above-described services, personnel, and equipment are provided solely by the Washington County Communications Commission.
- 8. The city of __Riverside_ and the city of Washington and Washington County hereby claim and do not waive all immunities from suit, including as provided in Chapter 670, Iowa Code (2007) and as amended, and in accordance with any applicable case law. Unless immune from suit, Washington County and the City of Washington, Iowa shall maintain appropriate insurance coverage or agrees to pay any and all damages assessed as a result of claims, settlements, judgments or lawsuits arising from the services, personnel or equipment under this agreement.

9. The city of _Riverside_ or the Washington County Communications Commission may terminate this agreement upon notice to the other party. Notice must be received by the Auditor's office on or before March 2, in order for the communications budget to be finalized. If the notice is received after March 2, the city of _Riverside_ must still pay the assessment for the upcoming fiscal year, and termination of the agreement will occur at the end of that fiscal year.

The city of __Riverside__ specifically understands and agrees that the personnel, equipment and services described above are not provided as part of any other agreement or contract with either the city of Washington or Washington County, such as the county law enforcement contract. The city of __Riverside_ also specifically agrees and understands that the payment of the E911 surcharge monies is not payment for the above-described services. In the event that the city of __Riverside_ does not sign this agreement or terminates this agreement, emergency 911 calls will be answered by the communications center. Those calls will either be routed directly to the agency which will respond, or those services will be paged to respond. All other calls will be forwarded to a dispatcher or official designated by the city. No other services will be provided unless this agreement is signed and timely payment is made.

10.	This agreement is effective when approved by the city council and signed by the designated official, and when signed by the chair of the Washington County Communications Commission. This agreement applies to FY '18-19 Communications budget. The amount due forRiverside would be\$39,726

Budget X (% of Assessed Value + % of Calls + % of Population)

Definitions of terms used in the Formula:

Budget is the total Communications Commission projected expense.

Assessed Value is derived from the most recent Auditor's Valuation Report.

Calls are data from the most recent calendar year Public Safety report of "Calls for Service".

Population is based on the current decennial Federal Census.
