RIVERSIDE CITY COUNCIL MEETING: November 5, 2018

The Riverside City Council meeting opened at 6:30 pm in City Hall with Mayor Allen Schneider requesting roll call. Council members present were: Tom Sexton, Bob Schneider Jr., Jeanine Redlinger, and Ralph Schnoebelen. Andy Rodgers was absent.

Motion by Schnoebelen to approve the agenda, Second by Schneider, passed 4-0.

Sexton moved to approve the minutes from October 15th, expenditures, and Casey's beer license renewal. Second by Schnoebelen, passed 4-0.

Council received minutes from 10/22/18 Board of Adjustments, 9/24/18 Final P&Z, and 10/22/18 P&Z.

Schnoebelen moved to open Public Hearing for sale of Lot 7 on Cherry Lane at 6:39 pm. Second by Redlinger, passed 4-0. There were no written or oral comments. Schneider moved to close Public Hearing at 6:39 pm. Second by Redlinger, passed 4-0.

Schnoebelen moved to pass Resolution #110518-01; Selling Lot 7 in the Cherry Lane Subdivision to John Crumly for \$35,000.00. Second by Sexton, passed 4-0.

Schnoebelen moved to pass 2^{nd} reading of Ordinance #101518-01; Rezoning 111 Knisel Street from R-2 Mixed residential to R-3 Multifamily Residential. Second by Schneider, passed 4-0. 3^{rd} reading will be at the 11/19/18 Council Meeting.

Scott Pottorff, MMS Consultants gave updates on Capital Projects.

Schnoebelen moved to extend Downtown Streetscape project to 11/16/18. Second by Schneider, passed 4-0.

Schnoebelen moved to pass Resolution 110518-02; Approving Pay Request #5 for Triple B Construction, in the amount of \$60,378.67 for the Galileo Drive Street Project. Second by Schneider, passed 4-0.

Schnoebelen moved to table Resolution #110518-03; Approving Final Galileo drive Street project until additional change order is complete. Second by Schneider. Passed 4-0.

Schneider moved to have Triple B install safety grates on the flared end sections in the detention basin for a cost of \$2075. Second by Redlinger, passed 4-0.

Sexton moved to pass Resolution #110518-04; Pay Request #2 to Triple B Construction for Hwy 22 Improvements Project in the amount of \$178,435.41. Second by Schnoebelen, passed 4-0.

Redlinger moved to pass Resolution #110518-05; Change Order #3 for Triple B Construction to remove the storm letdown flume on the corner of Ella and St. Mary's street, at the request of property owner. MMS Consultants will pay 50% of \$1335.00 cost. Second by Schnoebelen, passed 3-1 Sexton opposed.

Schnoebelen moved to replace the tree at the corner of Sycamore and Hwy 22 if damaged by the street project within 3 years. Second by Redlinger, passed 4-0. City will remove dead tree, and replace with a new tree.

Redlinger moved to remove tree at 281 St. Mary's Street that will affect the street project, at a cost not to exceed \$1500. Second by Schneider, passed 4-0. MMS will contact Alliant Energy for possible cost share.

Redlinger moved to pass Resolution #110518-06; Approving Professional Services Agreement with MMS Consultants for the Ash/Tupelo, and Safe Walk to School projects. Second by Schneider, passed 4-0.

Redlinger moved to proceed with Community Catalyst Grant program. A pre-application will be submitted with Bob Ryan's project. Second by Schnoebelen, passed 3-1 Schneider opposed.

Bill Stukey, PeopleService, Inc. presented options for replacement of Water Plant stage 2 membranes. Sexton moved to proceed with Option #1, replacing 63 membranes at a cost of \$42,563.94 plus freight. Second by Redlinger, passed 4-0.

Sexton moved for the City to take no action on the citizen request to have tree removed at 10 N. Washington Street. Second by Redlinger, passed 4-0.

No action was taken on Resolution #110518-06 Health Insurance for 2019.

Redlinger moved to retain Iowa Municipal Benefits Plan as the City Agency for healthcare insurance. Second by Schnoebelen, passed 4-0.

Schneider moved to split the 4th quarter 2018 City insurance premium savings with employees at the same rate. Second by Redlinger, passed 4-0.

Mayor reported on the Riverside Community Corporation Shareholders meeting held on 10/29/18. Warranty Deed of title was signed over to the City of Riverside.

City has been involved with Washington County Contract Law meetings.

Sexton moved to adjourn at 9:17 pm. Second by Redlinger, passed 4-0.

Training:

Members trained on apparatus placement at a structure fire, roof types and how to operate on them for vertical ventilation, fire attack/hose line options and forcible entry. All of this training was done utilizing our new training building. The addition of this building has really expanded our training options and the realistic evolutions we can put our members through. This makes for a better prepared fire department to respond within the community.

RESA

The raffle dinner was completed and all bills paid for the event, we raised around \$12,000 dollars this year. This money will be used towards the completion of our new grass truck and future training needs.

Other News

The new grass truck has got the pump and tank installed and is now getting the emergency warning lights and siren. The vehicle will then go get decals and members will make a few final adjustments to it. Several members have put in a lot of time to work on this project and keep the cost down on it. We hope to have this truck in service by mid November. 

STORM SEWER EASEMENT AGREEMENT

HIGHWAY 22 IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT

RIVERSIDE, IOWA

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into by and between Ellen Hall ("Property Owner"), which expression shall include its successors in interest and assigns, and the City of Riverside, Iowa (the "City"), which expression shall include its successors in interest and assigns.

WITNESS ETH:

It is hereby agreed as follows:

For the sum of \$1.00 plus other valuable consideration, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, Property Owner hereby grants and conveys to the City an easement for the purposes of excavating for and the installation, replacement, maintenance and use of such storm water lines, pipes, mains, conduits and overland drainageways as the City shall from time to time elect for conveying storm water, with all necessary appliances and fittings for the use in connection with said pipe lines, together with adequate protection therefor, and also a right of way, with the right of ingress and egress thereto, over and across the areas designated as "Storm Sewer Easement" on the attached easement plat and referred to herein as "easement areas."

Property Owner further grants to the City:

The right of grading said easement area for the full width thereof, and to extend the cuts and fills for such grading into and onto said lands along and outside of the said easement area, to such extent as the City may find reasonably necessary.

The right from time to time to trim, to cut down and clear away any and all trees and brush on said easement area, and also to trim, cut down and clear away any trees on either side of said strip which now or hereafter in the opinion of the City may be a hazard to said easement areas or which may interfere with the exercise of the City's rights hereunder in any manner.

The City shall promptly backfill any trench made by it, and repair any damages caused by the City within the easement area. The City shall indemnify Property Owner against unreasonable loss or damage which may occur in the negligent exercise of the easement rights by the City. Except as expressly provided herein, the City shall have no responsibility for maintaining the easement area.

Property Owner reserves the right to use said easement areas for purposes which will not interfere with the City's full enjoyment of the rights hereby granted; provided that the Property Owner shall not erect or construct any building, fence or other structure, plant any trees, drill or operate any well, or construct any reservoir or other obstruction on said area, or diminish or substantially add to the ground cover over said easement areas.

The proposed work is in the vicinity of an existing tree which will likely have damage to the roots during the work. The City agrees to remove the existing tree and install a tree (5'-6' install height) to replace this tree or to compensate the Property Owner for removal of existing tree and installation of a new tree if the existing tree dies within 3 years of the construction. If the new tree is installed more than 1 year after completion of the project, a tree with a 10'-12' install height will be installed.

Property Owner does hereby covenant with the City that it is lawfully seized and possessed of the real estate above described, and that it has a good and lawful right to convey it, or any part thereof.

The provisions hereof shall inure to the benefit of and bind the successors and assigns of the respective parties hereto, and all covenants shall apply to and run with the land and with the title to the







I am a little bit hesitant to start tearing out any more sidewalk or paving this fall. With the temperatures like they are there isn't much concrete that can be poured. I don't want to get into a situation where Sycamore Street is closed all winter or where some sidewalks are removed all winter along Highway 22 in the vicinity of the school. Triple B says they are concerned about the completion date if they don't continue work this fall. Also worried about perception if the weather does warm up and they aren't working.

At a minimum they need to finish up St. Mary's Street and get it opened up for the winter. They have committed to that to me. But they also want to start some storm sewer work along the highway and I guess that is OK with me as long as we don't impact streets or sidewalks. I don't know how much they can do without impacting streets and sidewalks.

Right now the forecast I see shows highs in the 40s for the rest of this week after today and then highs in the 40s next week. Based on those temperatures work can continue and concrete can be poured. But next week is a short week with Thanksgiving and who knows what things will be like after Thanksgiving.

In my mind having sidewalks or streets closed all winter is a nightmare. Maybe others don't feel as strongly as I do about that. I guess I would prefer to give more time in the spring when the weather is better than to try to push something this fall and end up with a problem all winter.

This agreement shall serve as the LPA's Title VI plan pursuant to 23 C.F.R. § 200 and 49 C.F.R. § 21. For the purpose of this agreement, "federal assistance" shall include all of the following.

- Grants and loans of federal funds.
- The grant or donation of federal property and/or interest in property.
- The detail of federal personnel.
- The sale and lease of, and permission to use (on other than a casual or transient basis), federal property or any interest in such property without consideration or at a nominal consideration, or at a consideration that is reduced for the purpose of assisting the LPA, or in recognition of the public interest to be served by such sale or lease to the LPA.
- Any federal agreement, arrangement or other contract that has as one of its purposes the provision of assistance.

The LPA shall:

- 1. Issue a policy statement, signed by the head of the LPA, which expresses its commitment to the nondiscrimination provisions of Title VI. The policy statement shall be circulated throughout the LPA's organization and to the public. Such information shall be published where appropriate in languages other than English.
- 2. Take affirmative action to correct any deficiencies found by the Iowa DOT, Federal Highway Administration or U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) within a reasonable time period, not to exceed 90 days, to implement Title VI compliance in accordance with this agreement. The head of the LPA shall be held responsible for implementing Title VI requirements.
- Designate a Title VI coordinator who has a responsible position in the organization and easy access to the head of the LPA. The coordinator shall be responsible for implementing and monitoring Title VI activities and preparing required reports.
- 4. Develop and implement a public involvement plan that includes low-income and minority community outreach and ensures those persons who are limited-English proficient (LEP) can access services.
- 5. Process complaints of discrimination consistent with the provisions contained in this agreement. Investigations shall be conducted by civil rights personnel trained in discrimination complaint investigations. Identify each complainant by race, color, national origin or gender, the nature of the complaint, date the complaint was filed, date the investigation was completed, disposition, date of disposition, and other pertinent information. A copy of the complaint, together with a copy of the LPA's report of investigation, shall be forwarded to the lowa DOT's civil rights coordinator within 60 days of the date the complaint was received by the LPA.
- 6. Collect statistical data (race, color, national origin, age, gender, disability, LEP and income of populations in service area) of participants in, and beneficiaries of, the programs and activities conducted by the LPA.
- 7. Conduct Title VI self-assessment of the LPA's program areas and activities, and of second-tier sub-recipients, contractor/consultant program areas and activities. Where applicable, revise policies, procedures and directives to include Title VI requirements. Ensure that programs, policies, and other activities do not have disproportionate adverse effects on minority and low-income populations.
- 8. Conduct training programs on Title VI and related statutes.
- 9. Prepare a yearly report of Title VI accomplishments and changes to the program covering the prior year, and identify goals and objectives for the coming year.
 - o Annual work plan: Outline Title VI monitoring and review activities planned for the coming year; and indicate a target date for completion.
 - Accomplishment report: List major accomplishments made regarding Title VI activities. Include instances where Title VI issues were identified and discrimination was prevented. Indicate activities and efforts the Title VI coordinator and program area personnel have undertaken in monitoring Title VI. Include a description of the scope and conclusions of any special internal and external reviews conducted by the Title VI coordinator. List any major problem(s) identified and corrective action(s) taken. Include a summary and status report on any Title VI complaints filed with the LPA. Include a listing of complaints received against second-tier sub-recipients, if any, as well as a summary of complaints and actions taken.
- 10. Include Title VI compliant language in all contracts to second-tier sub-recipients.

 IV. Discrimination complaint procedures – allegations of discrimination in federally assisted programs or activities

The LPA adopts the following discrimination complaint procedures for complaints relating to federally assisted transportation-related programs or activities.

1. Filing a discrimination complaint: Any person who believes that he or she, or any class of individuals, or in connection with any disadvantaged business enterprise, has been or is being subjected to discrimination prohibited by Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, 42 U.S.C. § 2000d; the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, 42 U.S.C. §§ 12101 et seq.; Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, 29 U.S.C. §§ 701 et seq.; and the Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987, Pub. L. No. 100-259, 102 Stat. 28, has the right to file a complaint.

Any individual wishing to file a discrimination complaint must be given the option to file the complaint with the LPA, or directly with the Iowa DOT, FHWA, USDOT and U.S. Department of Justice. Complaints may be filed with all agencies simultaneously.

No individual or agency shall refuse service, discharge or retaliate in any manner against any persons because that individual has filed a discrimination complaint, instituted any proceeding related to a discrimination complaint, testified, or is about to testify, in any proceeding or investigation related to a discrimination complaint, or has provided information or assisted in an investigation.

2. **Complaint filing time-frame:** A discrimination complaint must be filed within 180 calendar days of one of the following.

(a) The alleged act of discrimination.

- (b) Date when the person(s) became aware of the alleged discrimination
- (c) Date on which the conduct was discontinued, if there has been a continuing course of conduct.

The LPA or their designee may extend the time for filing or waive the time limit in the interest of justice, specifying in writing the reason for so doing.

- 3. **Contents of a complaint:** A discrimination complaint must be written. The document must contain the following information.
 - The complainant's name and address, or other means by which the complainant may be contacted.
 - b) Identification of individual(s) or organization(s) responsible for the alleged discrimination.
 - A description of the complainant's allegations, which must include enough detail to determine if the LPA has jurisdiction over the complaint and if the complaint was filed timely.
 - Specific prohibited bases of alleged discrimination (i.e., race, color, gender, etc.)
 - e) Apparent merit of the complaint.
 - f) The complainant's signature or signature of his/her authorized representative.

In the event that a person makes a verbal complaint of discrimination to an officer or employee of the LPA, the complainant shall be interviewed by the LPA's Title VI coordinator. If necessary, the Title VI coordinator will assist the complainant in reducing the complaint to writing and then submit the written version of the complaint to the person for signature.

4. **Complaints against the LPA:** Any complaints received against the LPA should immediately be forwarded to the Iowa DOT for investigation. The LPA shall not investigate any complaint in which it has been named in the complaint. The contact information for the Iowa DOT's Title VI program is:

- 5. **Notice of Receipt:** All complaints shall be referred to the LPA's Title VI coordinator for review and action. Within 10 days of receipt of the discrimination complaint, the coordinator shall issue an initial written Notice of Receipt that:
 - a) Acknowledges receipt of the discrimination complaint.
 - b) Advises the complainant of his/her right to seek representation by an attorney or other individual of his or her choice in the discrimination complaint process.
 - c) Contains a list of each issue raised in the discrimination complaint.
 - d) Advises the complainant of the timeframes for processing the discrimination complaint and providing a determination.
 - e) Advises the complainant of other avenues of redress of their complaint, including the lowa DOT, FHWA, USDOT and USDOJ.
- 6. **Notification of the Iowa DOT of a complaint:** The LPA shall advise the Iowa DOT within 10 business days of receipt of the complaint. Generally, the following information will be included in every notification to the Iowa DOT.
 - a) Name, address and phone number of the complainant.
 - b) Name(s) and address(es) of alleged discriminating official(s).
 - c) Basis of complaint (i.e., race, color, national origin, gender).
 - d) Date of alleged discriminatory act(s).
 - e) Date of complaint received by the LPA.
 - f) A statement of the complaint.
 - g) Other agencies (state, local or federal) where the complaint has been filed.
 - h) An explanation of the actions the LPA has taken or proposed to resolve the issue identified in the complaint.
- 7. **Processing a complaint and time-frame:** The total time allowed for processing the discrimination complaint is 90 calendar days from the date the complaint was filed. There is no extension available at this level. This time-frame includes 60 calendar days at the LPA level and 30 days for review at the state level, if needed.

If the complainant elects to file a complaint with both the LPA and Iowa DOT, the complainant shall be informed that the LPA has 90 calendar days to process the discrimination complaint and the Iowa DOT shall not investigate the complaint until the 90 calendar-day period has expired.

Immediately after issuance of the Notice of Receipt to the complainant (step four), the LPA's Title VI coordinator shall either begin the fact-finding or investigation of the discrimination complaint, or arrange to have an investigation conducted.

Based on the information obtained during that investigation, the coordinator shall render a recommendation for action in a Report of Findings to the head of the LPA.

8. Alternative dispute resolution/mediation process: The complainant must be given an invitation to participate in mediation to resolve the complaint by informal means. The LPA's Title VI coordinator shall include an invitation to mediation with the Notice of Receipt, offering the opportunity to use the alternative dispute resolution/mediation process.

If the complaint selects mediation, it allows disputes to be resolved in a less adversarial manner. With mediation, a neutral party assists two opposing parties in a dispute come to an agreement to resolve their issue. The mediator does not function as a judge or arbiter, but simply helps the parties resolve the dispute themselves.

Upon receiving a request to mediate, the LPA's Title VI coordinator shall identify or designate a mediator who must be a neutral and impartial third party. The mediator must be a person acceptable to all parties and who will assist the parties in resolving their disputes.

If the complainant chooses to participate in mediation, she or he or the designee must respond in writing within 10 calendar days of the date of the invitation. This written acceptance must be dated and signed by the complainant and must also include the relief sought.

After mediation is arranged, a written confirmation identifying the date, time and location of the mediation conference shall be sent to both parties. If possible, the mediation process should be completed within 30 calendar days of receipt of the discrimination complaint. This will assist in keeping within the 90 calendar-day time-frame of the written Notice of Final Action if the mediation is not successful.

If resolution is reached under mediation, the agreement shall be in writing. A copy of the signed agreement shall be sent to the Iowa DOT's Title VI program coordinator. If an agreement is reached, but a party to it believes his/her agreement has been breached, the non-breaching party may file another complaint. If the parties do not reach resolution under mediation, the LPA's Title VI coordinator shall continue with the investigation.

- 9. **Notice of Final Action:** A written Notice of Final Action shall be provided to the complainant within 60 days of the date the discrimination complaint was filed. It shall contain:
 - a) A statement regarding the disposition of each issue identified in the discrimination complaint and reason for the determination.
 - b) A copy of the mediation agreement, if the discrimination complaint was resolved by mediation.
 - c) A notice that the complainant has the right to file a complaint with the Iowa DOT, FHWA, USDOT or USDOJ within 30 calendar days after the Notice of Final Action, if she or he is dissatisfied with the final action on the discrimination complaint.

The LPA's Title VI coordinator shall provide the lowa DOT's Title VI program coordinator with a copy of this decision, as well as a summary of findings upon completion of the investigation. Should deficiencies be noted in the implementation of these discrimination complaint procedures by the LPA, the lowa DOT's Title VI program coordinator will work in conjunction with the LPA's Title VI coordinator to review the information and/or provide technical assistance in the discrimination complaint process, mediation process, and/or investigation.

- 10. **Corrective action:** If discrimination is found through the process of a complaint investigation, the respondent shall be requested to voluntarily comply with corrective action(s) or a conciliation agreement to correct the discrimination.
- 11. **Confidentiality:** LPA and Iowa DOT Title VI program coordinators are required to keep the following information confidential to the maximum extent possible, consistent with applicable law and fair determination of the discrimination complaint.
 - a) The fact that the discrimination complaint has been filed.
 - b) The identity of the complainant(s).
 - c) The identity of individual respondents to the allegations.
 - d) The identity of any person(s) who furnished information relative to, or assisting in, a complaint investigation.
- 12. **Record keeping:** The LPA's Title VI coordinator shall maintain a log of complaints filed that alleged discrimination. The log must include:
 - a) The name and address of the complainant.
 - b) Basis of discrimination complaint.
 - c) Description of complaint.
 - d) Date filed.
 - e) Disposition and date.
 - f) Any other pertinent information.

All records regarding discrimination complaints and actions taken on discrimination complaints must be maintained for a period of not less than three years from the final date of resolution of the complaint.

V. Sanctions

In the event the LPA fails or refuses to comply with the terms of this agreement, the lowa DOT may take any or all of the following actions.

- a) Cancel, terminate or suspend this agreement in whole or in part.
- b) Refrain from extending any further assistance to the LPA under the program from which the failure or refusal occurred, until satisfactory assurance of future compliance has been received from the LPA.
- c) Take such other action that may be deemed appropriate under the circumstances, until compliance or remedial action has been accomplished by the LPA.
- d) Refer the case to the USDOJ for appropriate legal proceedings.

- 3. The Recipient will insert the clauses of Appendix A and E of this Assurance in every contract or agreement subject to the Acts and the Regulations.
- 4. The Recipient will insert the clauses of Appendix B of this Assurance, as a covenant running with the land, in any deed from the United States effecting or recording a transfer of real property, structures, use, or improvements thereon or interest therein to a Recipient.
- 5. That where the Recipient receives Federal financial assistance to construct a facility, or part of a facility, the Assurance will extend to the entire facility and facilities operated in connection therewith.
- That where the Recipient receives Federal financial assistance in the form, or for the acquisition of real property or an interest in real property, the Assurance will extend to rights to space on, over, or under such property.
- 7. That the Recipient will include the clauses set forth in Appendix C and Appendix D of this Assurance, as a covenant running with the land, in any future deeds, leases, licenses, permits, or similar instruments entered into by the Recipient with other parties:

 - a. withholding payments to the contractor under the contract until the contractor complies; and/or
 - b. cancelling, terminating, or suspending a contract, in whole or in part.
- 6. **Incorporation of Provisions:** The contractor will include the provisions of paragraphs one through six in every subcontract, including procurements of materials and leases of equipment, unless exempt by the Acts, the Regulations and directives issued pursuant thereto. O & M Report: October 2018

Water Operation & Maintenance

- ➤ All hydrants were flushed and oiled per bi-annual maintenance. The hydrant at the intersection of 3rd St and Ella is in poor condition and will be marked as out of service and fire department notified. We will wait on replacement of the hydrant to see when the water main on 3rd St will be replaced.
- Suez completed their annual inspection of the water tower on October 12th. We are still waiting on the final report.
- > I looked into what it would take to run a service line to 3135 115th St. The service would have been around 1000' long and would need to be bored underneath Vine Ave. After speaking with some boring companies and the homeowner, he has decided to try and rehab his current well.
- > New meters were installed at 111 and 116 Cherry Lane. These were the last two meters we had in stock and 12 more were ordered for upcoming new construction homes.
- > All cartridge filters were changed for preventative maintenance.
- > 36 locates for October, all complete.

Wastewater Operation & Maintenance

> I pulled SAM Pump 1B at the wastewater plant for failure to run. After pulling I found the pump had a short in the motor and was sent to Iowa Pump for repair. I replaced the pump with a spare and all pumps are operational.






- > The sludge transfer pump was pumping at a reduced rate. I pulled the pump and found it was partially clogged with settled sludge. I washed the pump off and cleaned the volute and put the pump back in service.


