*Mayor Schneider began work session at 6pm for discussing various grant programs, and possible water rate change. No decisions were made/voted upon.*

*Group reviewed Economic Development Grant for Copper Creek Ridge in the maximum amount of \$40,000, tax rebates for property tax paid within five years. Yancey will send to Dorsey-whitney and Sueppel for review.*

*Downtown Buisness District Incentive Program: applicants may receive up to \$10,000 for \$20,000 in expenses for upgrades to building.*

*Resident "Community Beautification" Incentive Program; residents apply for max of \$5000/\$2500 for work to exterior of home with expense of \$10,000/ \$5000.*

*Hotel-Motel Grant program; consider change to all (501) non-profits.*

*Group discussed the Water Fund cash flow analysis done by Michael Hart of Northland Securities. Options to raise 3% each year, or a \$1 increase every 3 years. At current rates operating cost will exceed income; sewer 2023 - water 2027.*
