Council reviewed the proposal for 2021 Sealcoat Work from LL Pelling. Motion made by Sexton, second by McGuire to approve proposal removing Alley from 3rd St North in the amount of \$1,003.45 plus cold patch until culvert can be repaired and adding Manhole on River Street at \$359.55 plus cold patch omitted on previous proposal provided in the council packet. Motion passed 5-0.

Council reviewed options for crosswalk option at the intersection of Cherry Street and Kleopfer Street. Motion made by Sexton, second by Redlinger to approve Option B. Motion passed 5-0. Formal quotes for construction will be provided at the April 19, 2021 meeting.

Council reviewed the committee suggestions for updates to both the Downtown Investment Grant and the Residential Grant. The Grant Committee will meet and present the final grants for council approval at the April 19, 2021 meeting.

We still need to get the dispatch CAD system upgraded for Fire and EMS response. This needs to be pushed by the communications commission, the City of Riverside is part of this. We will continue to explore the idea of a Firefighter/Paramedic position at RFD to provide 24 hour advanced level care along with doing other jobs for inspections as needed.

History and Uses

The citizenry of the City of Riverside approved the implementation of the Hotel-Motel Tax in November of 2006 with the tax to become effective January 1, 2007. The percentage approved was seven percent and is imposed upon the gross receipts from the renting of any and all rooms, apartments, or sleeping quarters in any hotel, motel, inn, public lodging house, rooming house, tourist court, or in any place where sleeping accommodations are furnished to transient guests for rent. The intended use of the tax was to promote community development and tourism in Riverside.

State Code 423A.7 (4) (a) governs the use of revenue derived from the tax and provides that:

- At least fifty percent of the revenues derived there from for the acquisition of sites for, or constructing, improving, enlarging, equipping, repairing, operating, or maintaining of recreation, convention, cultural, or entertainment facilities including but not limited to memorial buildings, halls, and monuments, civic center convention buildings, auditoriums, coliseums, and parking areas or facilities located at those recreation, convention, cultural, or entertainment facilities or the payment of principal and interest, when due, on bonds or other evidence of indebtedness issued by the County or City for those recreation, convention, cultural, or entertainment facilities, or for the promotion and encouragement of tourist and convention business in the City or County and surrounding areas.
- The remaining revenues may be spent by the City or County, which levies the tax for any city or county operations authorized by law as a proper purpose for the expenditure within statutory limitations of City or County revenues derived from ad valorem taxes.

Eligibility and Allocation Procedures

All entities, excepting government entities, must be non-profit as recognized by the Internal Revenue Code of the United States to be eligible for the consideration of the allocation of these funds.

All recommendations on allocations shall be subject to City Council approval.

Resolution: Allows council members to allocate funding to requesting organizations through a resolution. Prior to allocating funding, organizations must provide written justifications for the funding requested. Justification would include how the funds will be spent, benefit provided to the City through funding their request, and the positive effect their organization will have on the community if the funding is granted. Eligible applicants would be defined as those organizations that qualify for one of the approved hotel-motel categories. Potential applicants for this funding would have a direct or clearly stated indirect potential impact on the future visitor or cultural enhancements. In addition, organizations

TrekFest is the annual celebration of Riverside's most famous fictional celebrity, Captain James T. Kirk. There are events for trekies and citizens alike. The entertainment is mainly free and is geared towards family friendly events.

RACC spent approximately half of their TrekFest earnings on capital improvements in Hall Park. St Mary's pancake breakfast proceeds are being used on historical preservation of the church. The ball association reinvests back into the ball fields in Hall Park.
- 12) How does your organization work: RACC is a group of people dedicated to the betterment of Riverside through community service, event management, community fundraising, and social and educational advancement.
- 13) Other information provide information you believe the Council should know: in recent past years TrekFest focused on keeping our expenditures close to home. TrekFest spent approximately \$5000 with businesses inside the City of Riverside. Almost all of the funds were spent within an hour drive of Riverside.

TrekFest is the annual celebration of our most famous fictional future citizen, Captain James T Kirk, and hosts a multitude of events that attract people from all ages and walks of life. There are also plenty of community events. Almost all events are free of charge and family friendly. Volley ball and softball games, a parade, water fight at the fire station, 5K Trek for the Schools, Bands, movies in the park, and a demo derby to name a few. Last year the robotics team from Highland did presentations at the event. This year we plan on expanding STEM activities for the kids.

2) Identify special and/or unique opportunities your organization's hotel-motel funding request provides residents and tourists in such areas as leisure opportunities, educational opportunities, programs that promote diversity and cultural awareness, special programs or collections, etc.

TrekFest has an unique opportunity that puts Riverside at the center of the area for one weekend. Papers from Washington, Cedar Rapids, Iowa City, and Kalona did features on the event and the town. In fact the Cedar Rapids gazette picked TrekFest XXXIII as one of that weekend's to three best bets for entertainment in a heavily competitive weekend.

Additional RACC projects that benefited the community:

The Kirk Birth Place — Riverside is the only town in the world that can boast, brag, and otherwise be proud to be called the future birthplace of a fictional character that is widely known, recognized by fans and non-fans alike. The area has a monument stone marking the spot of this future historic event.

The USS Riverside—This ship that marks the Voyage Home Museum has been in numerous parades and has been requested at many Star Trek events that help promote Riverside. Many people come from all over the country just to see it and get their picture taken with it and visit our town.

 Identify ways in which your organization works with other organizations to bring visitors to Riverside. Address any of the following that occurred during the previous year: Partnerships, collaborations, joint marketing, etc.

In the past year RACC has partnered with the Riverside Town Ball Association, Highland ESO, the Boy Scouts, the Robotics Club, St Mary's Preservation Fund, Iowa Friends of Companion Animals, and the Riverside Community Fire Department. These partnerships allowed TrekFest XXXIII to be one of the most successful in recent years. RACC has committed to continuing these relationships and grow additional relationships to help with community events in the future. By committing to these partnerships RACC can focus on growing and expanding the scope and number of events. Adding additional events and making currently scheduled events better brings in more people to the community and creates a buzz about the City of Riverside. Showing that a small town like Riverside can have "big town" events will help the City market the new housing development to people that may be anxious about moving to a smaller community.

For TrekFest XXXIII a comprehensive marketing plan was developed and committed to. The TrekFest board was able to grow sponsorships from approx. \$3000 to approx. \$8000. We have been able to maintain around this level in the following years. This did fall short of our original goal of \$10,000 for sponsorships. We returned all sponsorships for last year's cancelled event. We except to only be around \$3500 in sponsorships for this year.

Water Operation & Maintenance

- ➤ I lowered and repaired the lid on a curb stop at 91 W 3rd St at homeowner's request. The lid had been hit by a mower.
- Jetco installed the new VFD for the interstage pump on RO train 3. We are starting to have intermittent issues with the interstage pump VFD's on the other two units. Jetco is looking into cheaper options to rebuild the VFD's for both units.
- ➤ I was called on Sunday March 14th to locate the curb stop at Riverside Auto Spa. They had a line break in their building and needed the water isolated. We were able to locate the curb stop and bring it up to grade.
- Christine and I finished creating a curb stop inspection form. The purpose of this form is to ensure the curb stops are in working order and up to code. We will inspect the curb stop and map its location when a property changes ownership.
- I worked with ISO to provide water information and hydrant data. This information is used to determine fire insurance rates for the City.
- > We have completed the spring valve exercising. These include all the valves within the City and we will do all the valves along the highway and outside the City in the fall.
- 4 door postings and no shut offs for March
- 21 locates and 2 emergency locates completed.






- I had a couple callouts to lift station 5 for pump two not running. I called Iowa Pump to look at this station. We have found the VFD is going bad and will need replaced. I am having them provide a quote to replace the VFD.
- > While Iowa Pump was in town, I had them look at a pump I suspected was clogged at lift station
 - 3. They pulled the pump and found a chunk of wood had been wedged between the impeller and casing. The wood was removed and no damage was done to the pump.
- Annual manhole inspections were completed and information updated in Diamond Maps. We have a few manholes that are very dirty and need routine cleaning due to low flows in those areas.
- UV has been installed per DNR requirements. We are required to provide wastewater disinfection from March 15th through November 15th each year.
- We applied a granular weed killer to each of the lift stations. The granules soak through the rock after wetting and will help stop weeds from growing throughout the year. Granular weed killer has a higher cost but does not require as frequent an application and saves time and helps prevent reapplication. The granules also help prevent leaching and overspray.



ORDINANCE #041921-01

ORDINANCE TO AMEND PORTIONS OF CHAPTER 106, 136, 155, 156, 157, 158, 159 OF THE RIVERSIDE, IOWA CODE OF ORDINANCES

Whereas, the City of Riverside City Council from time to time finds it necessary to amend portion of chapters of the Riverside, Iowa Code of Ordinances,

Therefore, be it resolved the City of Riverside City Council does hereby approve the following amendments:

Amend Chapter 106.08: COLLECTION FEES. The collection and disposal of solid waste as provided by this chapter are declared to be beneficial to the property served or eligible to be served and there shall be levied and collected fees therefor in amounts established by ordinance. The fees will be as follows:

- 35-gallon trash \$17.50 per month
- 65-gallon trash \$19.50 per month
- Stick pickup \$.50 per month

All garbage fees included weekly garbage and recycling pickup.

All fees are due and payable under the same terms and conditions provided for payment of a combined service account as contained in Section 92.04 of this Code of Ordinances. Solid waste collection service may be discontinued in accordance with the provisions contained in Section 92.05 if the combined service account becomes delinquent, and the provisions contained in section 92.08 relating to lien notices shall also apply in the event of a delinquent account.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 384.84)

Amend Chapter 136.03: REMOVAL OF SNOW, ICE AND ACCUMULATIONS. It is the responsibility of the abutting property owners to remove snow and ice and accumulations from sidewalks within forty-eight (48) hours. If snow has not been removed within twenty-four (24) hours, an attempt will be made by city staff to contact the property owner. If the contact attempt is unsuccessful, or the sidewalk has not been cleared, a notice will be posted on the door of the address giving 24 hours to remove the accumulated snow from the sidewalk. If sidewalk is not cleared 24 hours after the door posting has been made, the City will contract to have the snow removed and the cost for removal will be billed to the property owner. The property owner has thirty (30) days from the date of the notice to remit payment to the City. Any bills left unpaid will become a lien against the property. This ordinance pertains to residential and commercial property.

Commercial properties located along Highway 22 between Greene and Washburn should have the upper sidewalk portion in front of their abutting property cleared of snow by 8:00 a.m. following the snowfall. The snow may be pushed to the lower sidewalk. City crews will remove the snow from the lower sidewalk and parking. If snow is not removed by 8:00 a.m., it is the responsibility of the property owner

to push the snow to the end of the street and not push it onto the cleared lower sidewalk. City staff will be responsible to clearing the stairs.

The eight (8) foot sidewalk located on the east side of Ella Street from 2nd Street to Blackberry will be maintained by the City of Riverside.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 364.12[2b & e])

Amend Chapter 155.01: ADOPTION OF INTERNATIONAL BUILDING CODE. Pursuant to published notice and public hearing, as required by law, the International Building Code, 2018 Edition, is hereby adopted in full by reference, except such portions as may be hereinafter deleted, modified, or amended. An official copy of the International Building Code, 2018 Edition, is on file in the office of the Clerk.

Remove 155.02 AMENDMENTS, MODIFICATIONS, ADDITIONS AND DELETIONS. The following amendments, modifications, additions, and deletions to the *International Building Code*, 2003 Edition, are hereby made:

1. Using the 2003 Primary Fee Table only along with the 2003 Building Valuation Data sheet as put out by the International Code Council and printed in the May 2003 issue of the *Building Safety Journal*, with a .50 modifier. Any future changes to the fees shall be set by Resolution of the Council.

Amend 156.01 ADOPTION OF INTERNATIONAL RESIDENTIAL CODE. 28E AGREEMENT

<u>EQUIPMENT SHARING AGREEMENT</u> BETWEEN THE CITY OF KALONA AND THE CITY OF RIVERSIDE

This Agreement is made and entered into by, between and among the undersigned cities, each having adopted this Agreement by resolution of its city council,

SECTION 1: IDENTITY OF THE PARTIES

The undersigned cities are political subdivisions and constitute "public agencies" as defined in Iowa Code section 28E.2. The initial member cities are Kalona and Riverside.

SECTION 2: PURPOSE AND GOALS

- 2.1 The purpose of this agreement is to create a system for the occasional sharing of municipal equipment, machinery (collectively referred to in this agreement as "equipment") between the parties for efficiency and effectiveness of operations.
- 2.2 The parties agree to make available to each other equipment listed on addendum A and related items in the manner and on terms and conditions provided in this agreement.

SECTION 3: TERM AND TERMINATION

- 3.1 Term. This Agreement shall be effective when the undersigned initial member cities, as listed in Section 1 execute this Agreement and this Agreement is filed with the Iowa Secretary of State as required by Iowa Code Section 28E.8 by 5/1/2021.
- 3.2 Termination. The term of this Agreement shall be perpetual, unless terminated by:
 - a) either public agencies provides a written request to terminate the equipment sharing agreement.

SECTION 4: SHARING PERIOD AND RATES

- 4.1 Equipment Catalog: Each provider shall maintain an accurate equipment sharing catalog that reflects the equipment that provider may make available for sharing, the rates and fee schedules for such equipment.
- 4.2 <u>Equipment Sharing Periods</u>: Equipment shall be provided upon reasonable request at mutually convenient times and locations for a duration mutually agreed upon by provider and borrower. Provider retains the right to refuse to any request for equipment for any reason.

- 4.3 <u>Storage During Sharing Period</u>: During the sharing period, borrower shall be responsible for storing the equipment in a reasonable safe and secure area.
- 4.4 <u>Charges for Equipment:</u> Charges shall be consistent with those listed in the equipment catalog, and shall begin accruing at the time borrower picks up or accepts delivery of the equipment and shall cease upon return of the equipment to provider.

SECTION 5: INVOICES AND PAYMENTS

- 5.1 Provider shall provide monthly invoices to borrower that show equipment rented, duration of the rental, rental rate, and total payments due for all equipment in the previous month.
- 5.2 Borrower shall pay provider's invoices in full within thirty (30) days of the date of invoice.

SECTION 6: EQUIPMENT USAGE

- 6.1 Operator Qualifications. The Parties agree to permit Equipment to be used only by properly trained, properly licensed and supervised operators. All drivers shall be licensed and shall have a satisfactory driving record. All equipment operators shall be properly trained and qualified to operate the Equipment shared under this Agreement. Borrower shall make available to Provider upon request proof of training, licensing, and qualifications of operator prior to release of Equipment.
- 6.2 <u>Usage Requirements.</u> Equipment shared under this agreement shall be used by Borrower's employees to conduct official business. Borrowers shall use and operate Equipment only for its intended purpose, in a careful manner and in compliance with all requirements for operation and of any governmental authority having jurisdiction, if applicable. Borrower shall not sublease or allow anyone other than Borrower's employees to use Equipment shared under this Agreement.

SECTION 7: EQUIPMENT DELIVERY AND PICKUP

- 7.1 <u>Delivery/Pickup.</u> Borrower shall be responsible for picking up and returning any Equipment shared under this Agreement, unless Provider and Borrower mutually agree to other arrangements. Equipment may be picked up and returned between 8 am and 4 pm, Monday through Friday, excluding holidays.
- 7.2 <u>Timely Return of Equipment.</u> Borrower shall return Equipment to Provider no later than one business day following conclusion of the share period.
- 7.3 <u>Inspections.</u> Providers sharing Equipment under this agreement certify that the Equipment is in good repair and ready for the intended use. Equipment shared under this Agreement shall be inspected by representatives of both Provider and Borrower at the time of delivery/pickup and again at the time of turn-in. The inspections shall include an examination of

the tires on the Equipment, which the Parties must agree are sound at the time Borrower picks up the Equipment, and which must have adequate tread depth to ensure safe and legal operation during the share period. The results of these inspections shall be documented on an Equipment Inspection Form and on a High Wear Item Inspection Form as identified and provided in each Provider's Equipment Catalog. Digital photographs of the equipment shall also be taken at the time of pickup to ensure that any existing damage is documented appropriately.

SECTION 8: EQUIPMENT FAILURE

- 8.1 Provider shall be responsible for the repair or replacement of Equipment when:
 - (1) Equipment fails during its normal operation, and;
 - (2) Equipment, is being used as intended by the manufacturer, and;
 - (3) Equipment has received all manufacturer required maintenance during its use by the Borrower.
- 8.2 Borrower shall be responsible to reimburse Provider for the cost of repair or replacement of Equipment when:
 - (1) Operating Equipment outside of its normal operation, or;
 - (2) Operating Equipment in a manner not intended by the manufacturer, or;
 - (3) Operating Equipment without performing required maintenance.
- 8.3 Borrower shall not claim damages from the Provider in the form of monetary, lost efficiency or time or consequential damage as a result of equipment failure.

SECTION 9: EQUIPMENT DAMAGE DUE TO ACCIDENTS

- 9.1 <u>Borrower Responsibility for Damage.</u> Borrower shall be responsible for the cost of repairing all damage to equipment incurred during the share period that is not considered to be normal wear and tear necessitated by misuse or negligent operation and for the maintenance and/or replacement of high wear items identified in each Provider's Equipment Catalog and as noted on each Provider's Equipment Inspection Form. For purposes of this agreement, the following definitions shall apply:
 - (1) "Normal wear and tear" is defined as dents, dings, paint chips, or scratches less than three inches in size, and interior wear such as soiled carpets and seats.
 - (2) "Excess wear and tear" is defined as dents, dings, paint chips or scratches more than three inches in size, cracked or punctured bumpers, chipped or cracked windshields, interior holes, burns, rips, tears or stains requiring heavy cleaning or replacement of fabric, interior damage such as gouged steering wheels or dashboards, missing equipment, and any interior or exterior damage attributable to collision, as well as mechanical repairs resulting from damage or negligence.

- (3) "Total loss" is defined as the estimated cost to repair the Equipment is equal to at least eighty percent of the retail market value of the Equipment prior to the damage, as determined by an independent appraisal.
- Notice to Provider. Borrower shall notify Provider immediately if Provider's Equipment is involved in any accident during the share period. Borrower shall promptly submit to Provider a written report of any accident that occurs in connection with this Agreement, in a form acceptable to Provider, and shall cooperate with any requests by Provider related to the accident. Borrower's report to provider must include, at a minimum, the following information: (1) name and address of any person injured or deceased, or the owner of any property that suffered damage as the result of the accident; (2) name and address of Borrower's employee(s) involved in the accident; (3) name and address of Borrower's liability insurance carrier, unless self-insured; and (4) a detailed description of the accident. Borrower also agrees to take all reasonable steps to preserve all evidence and information that may be relevant to the circumstances surrounding a potential claim, and to allow Provider to review and inspect such evidence and the scene of the accident.
- 9.3 <u>Accident Damage Repair.</u> Except as otherwise provided below, Borrower shall be responsible for the cost of repairing all Equipment damage due to accidents. In cases where equipment damage is caused by a third party and that party assumes responsibility, Borrower shall arrange to have the equipment repaired and shall seek reimbursement from the third party and/or that party's insurance carrier. Borrower shall notify Provider prior to commencing any repairs, and Provider has the right to accept or reject the repairs upon inspection.
- 9.4 <u>Damage Due to Equipment Defect.</u> Provider shall be responsible for the cost of repairing all Equipment damage due to accidents caused by equipment defects.
- 9.5 <u>Damage Resulting in Total Loss.</u> In cases of equipment damage resulting in a total loss, Borrower shall be responsible for covering the loss. Provider shall submit an invoice to Borrower, equal to eighty percent of the current retail market value of the Equipment prior to the damage as determined by an independent appraisal, for any Equipment determined to be a total loss.

In cases of Equipment damage resulting in a total loss caused by a third party where that party assumes responsibility, Borrower shall seek reimbursement from the other party's insurance carrier. If the reimbursement is greater than eighty percent of the retail market value prior to the damage, Borrower shall give the entire amount of the reimbursement to Provider.

Provider shall not be entitled to consequential damage for the loss of use of the equipment due to accidental damage.

9.6 <u>Stolen Equipment</u>. Borrower shall assume responsibility if Provider's Equipment is stolen during the time that the borrower has borrowed the equipment, and shall pay Provider eighty percent of the retail market value of the equipment. If the parties cannot agree on the value, the parties shall retain an independent appraisal. The cost of the appraisal shall be paid jointly by the parties, 50% each. If stolen equipment is recovered subsequent to the delivery of

replacement equipment to Provider, Provider may choose to give the recovered equipment to Borrower or refund a portion of Borrower's payment, at Provider's discretion.

SECTION 9: WARRANTY

9.1 Provider is neither a manufacturer nor supplier of the Equipment and therefore makes no warranties, express or implied, including, without limitation, the condition of the equipment, its design, capacity, performance, construction, workmanship, or fitness for any particular use. All Equipment is shared on an "as-is" basis. Provider shall not be responsible or liable to Borrower for any loss, delay, or damage of any kind resulting from defects in or accidental breakage of Equipment shared under this agreement.

SECTION 10: INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

10.1 Borrower is an independent contractor and shall not for any purpose be deemed to be an employee, agent or other representative of Provider.

SECTION 11: ASSIGNMENT

11.1 The Parties shall not assign, sublet, transfer, or otherwise substitute their interests in this Agreement, or any of their rights or obligations under this Agreement, without the prior written consent of all other Parties.

SECTION 12: INSURANCE

12.1 During the term of this agreement, each party will keep in force, at its own expense, insurance requirements as specified in Addendum A.



The City of Riverside is seeking Requests for Qualifications from selected engineering forms for general municipal and project engineering services. The selected firm will be responsible for day-to-day engineering needs that will include but not limited to general civil, water and wastewater and land development with fieldwork, and other duties. Major projects may still be bid out to qualified engineering firms, including the firm selected in this process.

Riverside is a city of approximately 1,000 residents. The City currently operates a ground water source water plant with two city wells, with a reverse osmosis treatment system, built in 2007. The wastewater system consists of five lift stations that flow into an SBR activated sludge plant with UV disinfection built in 2006. The City has been actively engaged in replacing all 4" water mains, upgrading storm water utilities as well as new concrete streets with curb and gutter.

It is expected that the selected firm would begin serving the City of Riverside in the capacity described in this Request for Proposals no later than May 1, 2021.

CITY OF RIVERSIDE

Password Policy

1.0 Overview

All employees and personnel that have access to organizational computer systems must adhere to the password policies defined below to protect the security of the network, protect data integrity, and protect computer systems.

2.0 Purpose

This policy is designed to protect the organizational resources on the network by requiring strong passwords along with protection of these passwords and establishing a minimum time between changes to passwords.

3.0 Scope

This policy applies to all personnel who have any form of computer account requiring a password on the organizational network including but not limited to a domain account and e-mail account.

4.0 Password Protection

- 1. The City will provide training on how to protect passwords.
- 2. Employees will follow password requirements and will protect their passwords.
- 3. If an employee feels their password has been compromised, notify the administrator immediately.

5.0 Password Requirements (subject to change)

Minimum Length - 10 characters recommended

- 1. Minimum complexity Passwords should use three of four of the following four types of characters:
 - 1. Lowercase
 - 2. Uppercase
 - 3. Numbers
 - 4. Special characters such as!@#\$ %^&*(){}[]
- 2. Passwords are case sensitive and the user name or login ID is not case sensitive.
- 3. Maximum password age 180 days

6.0 Enforcement

Since password security is critical to the security of the organization and everyone, employees that do not adhere to this policy may be subject to disciplinary action up to and including dismissal.

CITY OF RIVERSIDE

COMPUTER/CELL PHONE USE POLICY

1.0 OVERVIEW

It is the intent of the City of Riverside to provide computer and cell phone access for employee use for business purposes. Employees may be offered a stipend for use of their personal phone, or a city owned cell phone may be issued. To maintain productivity, work computers will be provided at city hall, the city shop, and the fire station. When it becomes necessary, laptops or iPads may also be provided by the City. Cell phones and computers are assigned to city staff for the duration of their employment with the City of Riverside.

2.0 USE OF CITY OWNED EQUIPMENT/CELL PHONE

All employees issued City of Riverside computers, laptops, iPads, or cell phones need to use these devices for City business only. Staff are responsible for care and good judgment when using any City owned device. If an employee notices any issues or suspects a virus, contact the City Administrator immediately. The City Administrator will immediately contact the company responsible for the security of the device and software.

While at work, employees are expected to exercise discretion in use of personal cell phone and electronic communication devices. Employees should limit personal calls during work hours, regardless of the phone use, as it can interfere with employee productivity, safety and may be distracting to others. Employees are prohibited from using any city owned device in any illegal, illicit, or offensive manner.

Drivers shall comply with all federal, state, and local laws and regulations regarding the use of cell phones or electronic communication devices while operating city equipment. No employee may use a cellphone or communication device while operating any City vehicles, equipment, or machinery. Sending or reading text messages, e-mails, viewing videos or inputting data in cell phones or laptop computers or navigation systems are prohibited while driving. Use hands free option if available for incoming calls. Employees who are charged with traffic violations resulting from the use of a cell phone while driving will be solely responsible for all liabilities that result from such actions.

City owned devices are not to be altered in any way, including but not limited to the operating system or software without the approval of the City Administrator.

All emails, text and phone messages for City business is subject to Open Records Law.

3.0 Antivirus Summary

Each device on a network will have a City business Antivirus client installed. Additional to including antivirus, there will also be antispam, web security and ransomware protection.

4.0 Patch Management

Microsoft and common 3rd Party applications are updated automatically minimally on a bi-weekly basis from a central repository via an installed remote monitoring and management (RMM) application installed on each network device.

5.0 Backup & Disaster Recovery

A managed service offering in which backup software creates an image backup of the Server to a standalone NAS device occurs nightly and is monitored daily. Additionally, a copy of the server image file is copied offsite nightly to an Iowa Solution Data Center. Local retention is set to 180 days and offsite retention is set to 3 days. Individual workstation backups are currently not performed. Please use the shared drive versus the C drive on each workstation to ensure backup of data.

Greetings to each of you. I hope this report finds you healthy, happy and enjoying spring in Washington County.

I was fortunate to have these meetings and opportunities this past week:

Community Foundation of Washington County...attended a meeting with the CFWC. We didn't have a quorum but had some great discussion about strategic planning and action steps for the near future to include Millie recording her presentation when explaining CFWC, to allow us to educate the community regarding the benefits of utilizing the CFWC.

Washington County Supervisors meeting/Present PDI BRE gratitude plaques...attended the Supervisors' meeting and presented plaques to Richard Young (WA Supervisor) and Jacob Thorius (WA County Engineer) to thank them in their part for the Premier 1 paving project, south of Washington.

Washington County GIS...met with Dewy Royer to create a wall-size map of Washington County to hang in our new board room for use by WEDG and WCRF.

Women of Washington luncheon...met with Sarah Grunewaldt (MSW), Michelle Redlinger and Alisha Davis (Chamber) and Patty Koller (WCRF). Discussed Childcare, workforce and future events coming soon.

Washington County Childcare Meeting with Michelle Redlinger and Tasha Beghtol (DHLW ECI) for introductions and to discuss collaborations with future childcare projects and studies. Tasha's organization did a great 4-county study of childcare, ages 0 - 5 in 2018.

Two separate business prospect meetings in the WEDG board room with potential business owners and Sarah Grunewaldt of Main Street Washington. Had great discussions with 2 entrepreneurs to discuss opportunities and next steps toward establishing a business.

Virtual meeting with Robyn Jacobson of ECICOG and a prospect for Kalona business. Organized a virtual meeting with Robyn Jacobson and prospect to discuss the possibility of a Revolving Loan Fund and the requirements to do so. The prospect seemed very interested and hopeful in this funding opportunity to fill a gap in funding he was facing.

Introduction and Tour of Brava Roof Tile with Eric Vander Horst. Had a very informative meeting with Eric and discussed the Brava Roof Tile business and then toured the facility. Eric, and the Brava Team, are avid supporters of WEDG and the work that we do. Eric shared that business has been good, despite the pandemic. They grew almost 30% last year! They continue to have job openings which they find challenging to fill. Eric mentioned that the 260E program with Kirkwood has been very successful. Brava moved into the former Whitesell property in September of 2020. Building material costs have gone up rapidly but allowed for great vertical integration/growth. Brava takes post-industrial plastics from other industries in our area to make their beautiful tiles, which they ship all over the world, including Disney and Dollywood! Brava has approximately 80 employees now and 7 national salesmen. Big jobs for Brava can take anywhere from 4 - 6 weeks. They are actively looking for 15 new employees! They offer great wages and benefit packages. They will be adding expensive equipment this year, raising their roof to accommodate this new equipment and improving docking spaces. They are currently leasing a large space of their property to another company for warehousing. Eric would love to have a rail line closeby to alleviate some of the truck traffic and increase efficiency.

Weekly meetings with bookkeeper, Dawn Schindler... April invoices were just delivered and checks arriving. Please let me or Dawn know if you are aware of any potential investors who would be interested in joining the WEDG family. Tax preparation is underway. Dawn will work closely with Mark Kendall, me and officers to complete our taxes.

SS Solutions/Lead Tracker training...regular meetings continue with Bob and Clark. We continue to discuss grant opportunities surrounding childcare and workforce, workforce visa ideas, transportation and housing. We also discuss prospects, funding sources, our CRM and any other issues that arise.

Workforce/Childcare Study for Washington County... This study is focused on Workforce as the central issue and how Childcare (or lack thereof) is one of the factors causing challenges!

I have completed and submitted both grant applications, one to ECICOG and one to the WCRF..

ECICOG has committed \$5000 to partnering with us on this study! We should hear more from WCRF soon! I received a proposal from First Childrens' Finance, in the amount of \$11,000 regarding a study for Washington county studying the effects of childcare, or lack thereof, on our workforce challenges. The cities of Washington, Kalona, Wellman, and Riverside have also committed financial resources. The Washington Chamber of Commerce (also a member of the SE Iowa Regional Child Care task force) has committed in-kind. We are fortunate to have so many great partners.
